






2006-2014 INDEX OF ITALIAN ORDERS OF WOODWORKING MACHINERY AND TOOLS

index: 2005=100














2014 ITALIAN EXPORT OF WOODWORKING MACHINERY market share



1.8 billion Euro: ITALIAN GDP OF WOODWORKING MACHINERY AND TOOLS PRODUCTION












TRADE BALANCE WHAT IS THE VALUE OF THE INDUSTRY Mio Euro
